These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon.

The saying is sure: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us; if we are faithless, he remains faithful--for he cannot deny himself.

Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

Who was St. Edward the Confessor?

Our patron saint was King of England from 1042 to 1066 A.D. He was the last of the Anglo-Saxon Kings to rule before the Norman Conquest. It has been said of him that "In a rough and brutal age, when might tended to be the only right, he was conspicuous for devotion, gentleness and goodness." He was called "the Confessor" because at one period he suffered exile for professing his Christian faith when the kingdom was temporarily overrun by the heathen Danes. His greatest work was the building of Westminster Abbey in London which was dedicated only a few days before he died and in which his tomb may be seen to this day. The Feast Day of St. Edward is October 13th. His coat of arms is also the official arms of this parish. In addition, a life size statue in his likeness is located in St. Edward's Churchyard.
