Who was St. Edward the Confessor?

Our patron saint was King of England from 1042 to 1066 A.D. He was the last of the Anglo-Saxon Kings to rule before the Norman Conquest. It has been said of him that "In a rough and brutal age, when



might tended to be the only right, he was conspicuous for devotion, gentleness and goodness." He was called "the Confessor" because at one period he suffered exile for professing his Christian faith when the kingdom was temporarily overrun by the heathen Danes. His greatest work was the building of Westminster Abbey in London which was dedicated only a few days before he died and in which his tomb may be seen to this day. The Feast Day of St. Edward is October 13th. His coat of arms is also the official arms of this parish. In addition, a life size statue in his likeness is located in St. Edward's Churchyard.
