The Second Lesson:

1 Corinthians 2:1-12

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him"— these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God.

Jesus said, "You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot.

In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

Affirmation of Faith (All Stand)

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you In thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, And by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, To the glory of your name. *Amen.*

The Priest stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen.*

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, Our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you; this is my Blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Background on today's service

In Gaelic the word for "church" is "kirk" and of course the colorful tartans represent the individual clans (or families) for easy recognition on the field of battle. The service of Kirkin o' the Tartans could therefore be translated as "the churching of the families." With that in mind, even if your name happens

to be something not quite Scottish, you are certainly a part of our celebration and our prayers today are for you and your family as well.

Our modern service of the Kirkin' had its beginnings in America during World War II at the Washington National Cathedral (which is a cathedral of the Episcopal Church) where it was introduced by the late Dr. Peter Marshall who was Chaplain of the U.S. Senate and Pastor of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church of Washington, D.C. The service was introduced as a means of supporting in prayer the subjects of Britain who were affected by the war while bolstering the morale of our own citizens. It quickly became very popular and continues to be an annual service of the National Cathedral (generally celebrated on the Feast of St. Andrew, November 30).

The ancient roots of this service are not fully documented but it is believed that Dr. Marshall simply revived a custom said to have originated in Scotland after the battle of Culloden when the British Parliament passed an act forbidding the wearing of the kilt or tartan material by the Scots.

The Scots defied this act by hiding small bits of tartan in their clothing when attending church and, at a certain sign from the minister, placed their hands on the bit of tartan as the minister recited a blessing.

What is the Consecration of Samuel Seabury?

On Mar. 25, 1783, ten clergy met at the home of the Rev. John Rutgers Marshall in Woodbury, Connecticut, and elected Samuel Seabury and Jeremiah Leaming as candidates for Bishop of Connecticut. Seabury accepted the election and sailed for England to be consecrated. He arrived in England on July 7, 1783, and spent over a



year trying to get consecrated by English bishops. For a number of reasons, including the need to take the oath of allegiance to the King of England, no bishops would consecrate Seabury. He then went to Scotland, where he was consecrated at Aberdeen on Nov. 14, 1784, at the chapel in the home of John Skinner, Bishop Coadjutor of Aberdeen. On Aug. 3, 1785, the clergy of the Connecticut convocation elected Seabury their bishop.
